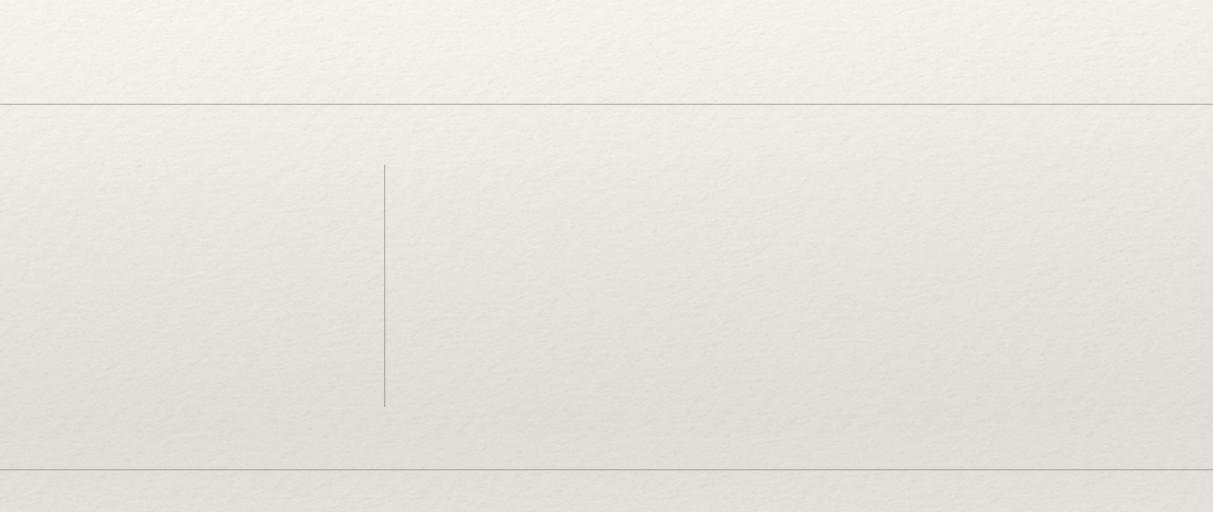


Thursday 24th, November - Riots in Dublin

- Three children and a school care assistant were stabbed outside a primary school on Thur
- Taoiseach (pronounced) Teeshock (=Irish Prime Minister) Leo Varadkar said about 500 people were involved in the disorder.
- After the stabbings, rumours spread on messaging apps and far-right agitators decided they would protest at the crime scene.
- This ended with the worst unrest to hit Ireland in decades, as rioters clashed with the police, set vehicles alight and looted stores.
