Since the case was decided in 1973, repeated legal challenges succeeded in

narrowing the scope of *Roe* v. *Wade*. In *Planned Parenthood of Southeastern* 

Pennsylvania v. Casey (1992), the Supreme Court **lowered** the standard that legal lessened / diminished

restrictions on abortion must meet **in order to be** held constitutional.

Roe v. Wade was ultimately **overturned** in Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Invalidated / repealed / nullified

*Organization* (2022). In that case, the Court voted 6-3 to **uphold** a Mississippi law to affirm

that **banned** almost all abortions after 15 weeks of pregnancy. Its decision prohibited / outlawed/restricted / made illegal

overturned both *Roe* and *Casey*. The *Dobbs* ruling thus allowed individual states

to legally **outlaw** abortion.
